Nominees for the 2018-2020 term were announced last month in the March edition of the Virginia Clubwoman.



The proposed 2018-2020 GFWC Virginia State Project – Human Trafficking Awareness & Prevention – was also announced in the state magazine.

Last year, Virginia ranked 15th in the U.S. with 156 reported cases of human trafficking. California was the highest with 1,305, followed by Texas with 792 and Florida with 604. While Virginia



does not have the same volume of reported cases, helping to identify or prevent even one case of human trafficking would be a colossal victory in the eyes of a potential victim. The proposed project seeks to spread awareness of this growing problem, in which some 300,000 people are trafficked annually in the U.S. alone and 1 out of 3 are children.

Buchanan County Autism Awareness 5K Walk/Run

Currently, we need the following donations: water, granola bars and/or bananas. JoBeth will order additional medals needed, consult Kiwanian Jon Rife in regards to the borrowing of their time recorder, and will collaborate with Kayla Cantrell of Buchanan County Robotics on volunteers, runner numbers, shirts, and tents. Au-some Summer Swim Program

Contact with the Buchanan County Public School System has been made to find out how many children with autism are currently enrolled. We will attempt to find out if any obstacles prevent parents from allowing their children to participate, such as transportation needs, and may award gas cards to those in financial need.

Special Needs Health Fair & Expo

This event will be held in conjunction with ACP's Annual Health Expo.

This event is to serve not only as a resource for parents regarding their child's healthcare, but also regarding other needs. A quiet room will be reserved for kids who need a dark, peaceful place during the event. If you are interested in making and/or teaching parents how to make their own 'calm down' bottles, please let JoBeth know. She'll be bringing the bottles and water pitchers. So if members can donate beads, glitter, buttons, small toys or whatever they have on hand to put inside the bottles, it would be appreciated.

The regular meeting of the GFWC Grundy Woman's Club was called to order March 5, 2018, 6:05 pm by President Glenna Owens at the Grundy Baptist Church. Owens welcomed the 16 members and Diane Lynch, guest of Sandy Stiltner, to the meeting.

Kim Anderson-Long led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Betty Shields brought the Thought for the Day, "Develop Your Abilities," and led the prayer of Grace before dinner.

Minutes of February 2018 meeting were approved on motion from Ginger Robertson. Treasurer's report showed an unchanged balance 2-28-18 of \$7,587.06 and, without objection, was placed on file.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND PROJECTS

- President Owens reported on Cinderella's Closet held February 24 from 9 am-5 pm at Grundy Baptist Church. More than 100 dresses were given away in this project held with the Christian Legal Society at the ASL. Jessica Robinson will post the final information.

- 3.
